This Easy Read will help you find out who your local federal **MP** is.




MP stands for Member of Parliament.



The MP shares things that are important in their area with the Government.



Sometimes you might want to contact your local federal MP to tell them something that is important or something that you want changed.



You need to find your local federal **electorate** first.



An electorate is the area where you live that has a local federal MP.



Your electorate has a special name for your area.

How to find your local federal electorate



There are 3 steps to find your electorate.



Step 1: Scan the QR code.



Or you can type <https://electorate.aec.gov.au/> into your web browser.



Step 2: Scroll down to the box called ‘**Search Federal Electorates**’ and type the **suburb** where you live in the box.



Your suburb is the neighbourhood where you live.



Step 3: Click the ‘**Find**’ button below the boxes.


How to find your local federal MP



There are 3 steps to find your local federal MP.



Step 1: Scan the QR code.



Or you can type https://www.aph.gov.au/Senators_and_Members/Parliamentarian_Search_Results into your web browser.

Step 2: Type the name of your electorate into the box below **'Search Senators and Members'**.

Great work! You have found your local federal MP.


Finding their contact details




There are 3 final steps to find the contact details for your MP.




Step 1: Click on the name of your local federal MP. This will take you to a webpage with all their information.



Step 2: Scroll down on the page and you will see their postal address.




You can use their postal address to send them a letter.



Step 3: Click on the 'Connect' button.



This button will take you to a page with their **email** address and **website** address.



You can copy and paste their email address into a new message if you would like to send them an email.



Or you can visit their website to see what they are doing in your local area.



If you have questions you can ask your site manager or support person to help you.
