
This means the letters are thicker and darker.

This Easy Read is about the price increase from the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).




The NDIA shared their **yearly pricing review**.

They have put up the amount of money that they will pay for services that you use.




Many people think that it was not put up by enough to cover what the services provide.

### How you can help



If you would like to, you can help by contacting your local federal **MP**.



MP stands for Member of Parliament.




The MP shares things that are important in their area with the Government.




You can tell them paying a fair price for the services you have funding for is important.



You can do this by writing a letter.



If you would like to write a letter, you can choose which option you would like to do.



1. We have written a letter that you can use to make it a bit easier if you would like.



2. You can use the letter that we have written and make any changes you would like.



You can ask your site manager to give you the letter.



In the letter it asks the Government to pay more to the NDIS to cover the cost of services.



When you are happy with your letter, you will need to follow the steps for **'How to get your letter ready to send'**.



You do not have to send a letter. It is your choice.

## How to get your letter ready to send



You will need to find out who the local MP in your area is.



We have created an Easy Read with steps you can follow to find your local federal MP.



The Easy Read is called '**How to find your local federal MP**'. You can ask your site manager for this Easy Read.



Read that Easy Read now and then return to this Easy Read and follow the steps for '**How to finish your letter to your local federal MP**'.

## How to finish your letter to your local federal MP

To: **Your local MP**  
Via email  
  
Dear **<local member>**,

Now that you know the name of your local federal MP you can put their name in the 'To' and 'Dear' section of the letter.

**IMPORTANT**

It is important to do this so the MP knows the letter is for them.

## How to send the letter to your local federal MP



You can send the letter to your local MP by post or email.




If you would like to post the letter there are 3 steps to follow.




**Step 1:** Write their full name and postal address on the front of an envelope.

**Step 2:** Print your letter and put it in the envelope ready to send.




**Step 3:** Put the envelope in a red postal box or you can ask someone to do this for you.



If you would like to email the letter there are 3 steps to follow.




**Step 1:** Copy and paste the MP email address into a new email message.

**Step 2:** Attach the finished letter to the email.



Don't forget to write who the email is from.



**Step 3:** You can send the email by yourself or ask someone you trust to help you.
